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- 5.—(1) The Council may take such steps from time to time as they consider necessaryor expedient for the improvement, maintenance and management of the harbour and the accommodation and facilities afforded in or connected with the harbour.
 - (2) For those purposes and without affecting the generality of paragraph (1), the Council may—

- (a) the public right of navigation in the harbour; and
- (b) any public rights of way affecting the harbour,
- (6) such that the Council shall not restrict such rights more than is necessary for the purpose for which the part of the harbouris appropriate ob r set apart.

Power to lease, etc.

The Council may at any time leaseor grant the useor occupation of, or any right or interest in, over or relating to, any lands, works, buildings, equipment or other property forming part of the harbour for such periods and on such terms and conditions as may be agreed between the Council and the person taking the same.

- (2) The Council may demand, receive and recoverin respectof any vesselusing any of the mooringsprovided by the Council underparagraph (1), or moored to land owned or leased by the Council, such reasonable harges as the Council may from time to time prescribe.
- (3) The Council may compound with any person with respect to the payment of the charges prescribed underparagraph (2).
- (4) The Council may from time to time grant a licence to any person to place, lay down, maintain, renewandusemoorings, buoysands imilar apparatusor vessels in the harbour.
- (5) Any personwho, without reasonablexcuse places, lays down, maintains, renewsor uses a mooring, buoy or similar apparatusor vessels within the harbourexcept under and in accordance with the terms and conditions of a licence granted under this article, shall be guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding evel 3 on the standard scale.

(7) The Council shall not underthe

- (I) prohibiting or regulating the dischargeor deposits of ballast, ashes, refuse, rubbish or othermaterial (including any polluting liquid) into or upon the harbour;
- (m) regulating the use of cranes, weighing machines, weights and measure spelonging to the Council, and the duties and conduct of weighers and meters employed by the Council;
- (n) regulatingor preventing the use of fires and lights within the harbour;
- (o) the conservation of the natural beauty of all or any part of the harbour or of any of the fauna, flora or geologicalor physiographica features in the harbour and all other natural features and
- (p) the conservation preservation or redevelopment of any buildings, plant or other artificial features of the harbour of historic or architectura bignificance.

General directions to vessels

22.—(1) The Council may, after consultationwith the Royal Yachting Association, the UK Chamberof Shipping, CMAL, the Commissioners of Northern Lighthouses, the Maritime and Coastguard Agency and such other persons as the Council considers are representative fusers of the harbour, give directions for any of the following purposes—

- (a) designatingareas, routes or fairways in the harbourwhich vessels are to use, or refrain from using for movement mooring or anchorage;
- (b) securing that vessels move only at certain times or during certain periods;
- (c) securing that vessels make use of descriptions of aids to navigation specified in the direction;
- (d) prohibiting entry into or navigation within any of the main fairways during any temporary obstruction thereof:
- (e) requiring the master of a vessel entering, leaving or intending to enter or leave the harbourto statethelengthoverall and draught maximum of their vessel;
- (f) prohibiting entry into or movement the harbourby vessels times of poor visibility due to the weatheror to the presence dust or smokeprovided that no such direction shall prevent the entry into the harbour the approaches any vesselseeking refuge from stress weather;
- (g) regulatingthe navigation, berthing, mooring and speecbf vessels within the harbour;

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Liability for charges
